Sunday Mass is also carried from the National Shrine, Notre Dame, and San Fernando Cathedral.

CatholicTV produces nearly 40 percent of its total programming from start to finish through the use of three studios, on-location shoots, two editing suites, a graphics suite, and production facilities at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross. 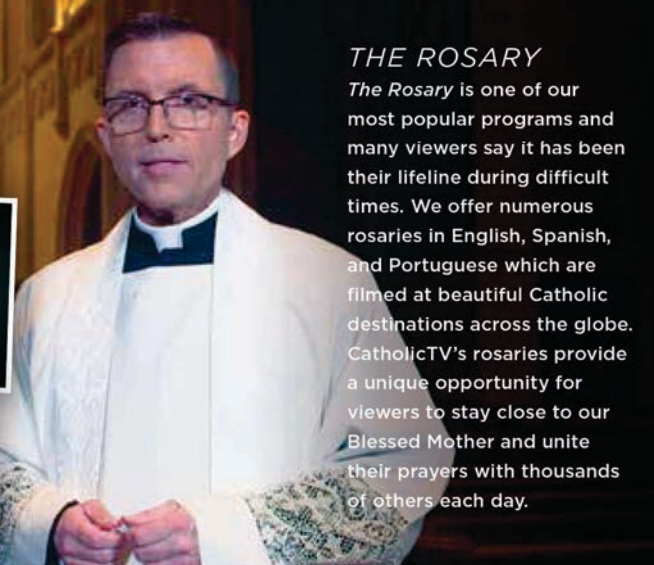
Live broadcasts

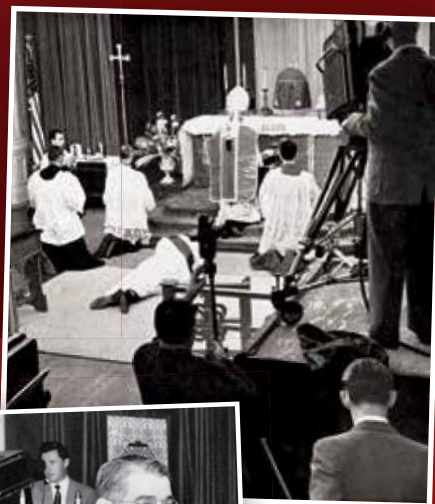

History of CatholicTV

On Jan. 1, 1955, Archbishop Richard J. Cushing celebrated a pontifical low Mass in a television studio near Kenmore Square in Boston. It was the first program ever produced by the Catholic Television Center of the Archdiocese of Boston and it was the first chapter in the story of The CatholicTV Network.

CatholicTV has grown from its humble beginnings as a small archdiocesan station with three cameras. Today, it has its own broadcasting station and has become the world's first full-time Catholic television station. It employs a general entertainment format along with Daily and Sunday Masses. The CatholicTV Network is recognized nationally as a leader in broadcast television for the purpose of evangelization and outreach.
